Street Updates

- Street Patching will continue through September.
- Repaving at the Fire Station side and rear will not happen till spring next year, as this area needs to settle longer.
- We will patch where the lines were dug to allow more time to settle as we do not want the new blacktop to sink.
- We are working on prepping High Street to grinding and paving that we are doing. The prep work includes tree removal which is also being done by us.
- Street sweeping continues Main Street early AM and the rest of the Village after 7AM.
- We are picking up a lot of old furniture & misc. throughout the village.
- Tree trimming, and removal is ongoing.
- Watering the flowers and the new trees are continuing but not much longer.
- We are still picking up a lot of brush that residents are bringing to the curbside.
- Street light repairs are complete on Main Street. The light that fell, the other 8 that the Village owns, we have fastened down and cleaned and painted the bases.
- Street sign repairs are ongoing, we replaced a lot of faded no parking signs and replaced several sign posts.
- 10 catch basins and 6 manholes have been rebuilt
- Sidewalk has been repaired on Grove St. and Elm St. where two large trees were removed.

Mayor and members of the board,

Patrol Monthly Activities:

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. We had a total of 405 calls for service during the month of August. We had a total of 7 Penal Law arrests which consisted of 6 misdemeanors and 1 violation. We issued a total of 63 vehicle and traffic tickets, which included 7 arrests for the unclassified misdemeanor of Aggravated Unlicensed Operation in the 3rd degree and 1 arrest for Aggravated Unlicensed Operation in the 2nd degree. Officers also responded and investigated 12 motor vehicle collisions, 9 of which involved property damage and 3 of which involved injuries.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of August: 5 separate larcenies where bikes were stolen from either off the porches or yards of residences (2 of the bikes were recovered and returned to the owners); a larceny from a motor vehicle where tools were stolen, 2 separate vehicle and traffic stops involving the same individual, who was stopped by patrol for a lighting defect and both times the individual fled (first time the individual fled in the vehicle he was operating and the second on foot), the individual was located at his residence after each incident and was arrested, the same individual however broke free and escaped as he was being escorted from court but was apprehended hours later and charged with escape and other related charges; an arrest of a subject on a parole warrant which led to the arrest of another individual on parole who also had a parole warrant that was located hiding in a residence in the village.

School Officers Reports:

No school resource officer's report due to summer vacation.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: There was a power issue involving the cameras at Durkee Park. The issue has since been corrected by Beard Electric regarding installing additional cameras at the police department.

Patrol vehicles updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance. There was an issue with the 250 (unmarked vehicle) involving an emission issue where it needed to be towed to Dovi Motors, but it was covered under warranty.

Bike patrol updates: due to the increase of bike larcenies in the village, officers have been patrolling more during the later evening or morning hours, focusing on preventing these types of larcenies

Grant updates: I received notification regarding the New York State traffic safety grant that I applied for in April for 2019. We have been awarded a total of \$3,811.00 to be utilized for traffic enforcement. No updates regarding the federal pilot grant program for funding for law enforcement for reducing trespassing on railroad property.

SRO contract updates: We are in the process of adding 3 additional SRO. The basic SRO school is being held in Binghamton and 2 new SRO are attending it. Cortland County District Attorney Patrick Perfetti has agreed to pay the tuition for the officers to attend it (\$275.00 each). When school begins 4 of the SRO's will have the basic SRO certification. The school has agreed to purchase some of the equipment for the SRO's to help off-set the costs.

Miscellaneous and Events: the annual "Cops on Top" fund raising event was held on August 3, 2018 at the Dunkin Donuts located at 31 South-West St. Officers from the Homer Police Department along with law enforcement officers across the state participated in this event to raise money for the Special Olympics. A total of \$1,488.51 was raised at the Homer location.

Magic on Main was scheduled to be held on August 17, 2018 but due to the inclement weather it was cancelled.

The "Pounding for Paws" race was held on Aug 18, 2018. Officers and members of the Homer Fire Department Fire Police assisted with traffic during the race and there were no incidents.

As mentioned in the July report, the donated shed is at the police department and is in use. However, due to weather it has not been painted yet. It will be painted sometime prior to the winter months.

In conclusion, on August 30, 2018, officers will be conducting commercial vehicle safety inspections with the New York State Police Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Unit in the lower parking lot of the high school off from Copeland Ave. This inspection is in response to the increase of commercial vehicles traveling through the village. Vehicles will be inspected for safety issues in an effort to save lives and reduce injuries.
