September 2018 Monthly report

Date: October 1, 2018

For the time period: 08/26/18 - 09/26/18

Mayor and members of the board,

Patrol Monthly Activities:

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. We had a total of 317 calls for service during the month of September. We had a total of 4 Penal Law arrests which consisted of 2 misdemeanors and 2 violations. We issued a total of 66 vehicle and traffic stops, which resulted in 3 arrests for the unclassified misdemeanor of Aggravated Unlicensed Operation in the 3rd degree and 1 arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. Officers also responded and investigated 12 motor vehicle collisions, 9 involved property damage and 3 involved injuries. An operator involved in 1 of the property damage collisions was arrested for Driving While Intoxicated.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of September: a domestic related incident where an individual was arrested for criminal mischief and criminal obstruction of breathing; criminal mischief to the lawn (park) at the corner of Clinton St and Warren St; follow-ups to a falsely reporting of an incident and a larceny.

School Officers Reports:

Please refer to the attached detailed school resource officer's report for September. There were a total of incidents that the resource officers were involved in during the month of February.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: No issues with the cameras during the month of September.

Patrol vehicles updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance.

Bike patrol updates: Due to the weather bike patrols have been limited. The grant funding from Cortland Area Communities That Care (CACTC) will continue for bike patrol until the end of October.

Grant updates: We are in the final stages of the 2018 New York State Traffic Safety Grant, which will end on September 30, 2018. The 2019 traffic safety grant, which we were awarded a total of \$3,811.00 will begin on October 1, 2018. As previously indicated this grant is for additional traffic enforcement in the village.

We received notification regarding the federal pilot grant program for funding for law enforcement for reducing trespassing on railroad property. We did not receive any funding for this grant.

As indicated in the August report, we along with the school district added officers to the school resource officer program. The new officers consist of Officer Quentin Giles, Officer Randy Andrews and Officer Kevin Soderholm. Officer Giles will be at the elementary school. He recently retired from the New York State Police after 21 years of service and was a K-9 handler. He also holds several certificates to include firearms and OC (pepper spray) instructor, all of which will be beneficial to the police department as it relates to training. Officer Andrews will be at the junior high school. He retired from the DeWitt Police Department in 2017 and during the last 7 years with DeWitt he was the department's juvenile investigator. Officer Soderholm will be the evening SRO. He recently retired from the Syracuse Police Department after 19 years of service and he was a k-9 handler with the Syracuse Police Department. Officer VanOrden and Officer Bort are returning from last year. Officer VanOrden will be at the high school.

Miscellaneous and Events:

Due to weather the Boy Scouts were not able to paint the shed. However the Village DPW were able to paint it on a dry day. I would like to take the time to thank Mike McCrory, Nick Casterline and Mike Harter for painting the shed for us.

On August 30, 2018, officers conducted commercial vehicle safety inspections with the New York State Police Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Unit and the New York State Department Environmental Conservation Police (DEC Police) in the lower parking lot of the high school off from Copeland Ave. This was in response to the increase of commercial vehicles traveling through the village. During the course of the day, 28 commercial vehicles were inspected, 11 of the vehicles were taken out of service for repairs and 5 drivers were taken out of service for various license violations. There were a total of 94 commercial vehicle violations, which included over weight or over length. Officers issued 24 traffic tickets related to log book or other violations and the DEC Police issued 3 tickets relative to the environmental laws.

On September 11, 2018, officers and members of the fire department attended the annual 9/11 ceremony in front of the village recreation building. This ceremony was in remembrance of the victim's that lost their lives as a result of the attacks on this country on September 11, 2001.

On September 15, 2018, the Cortland County Fire Investigation Team held their first annual fire investigation seminar at the Homer Elks. Over fifteen various police, fire and ems agencies from across Central New York were in attendance. The seminar was intended to raise funds for the team so that they can purchase equipment or attend future training. The seminar was sponsored by various insurance companies and fire equipment vendors from the Cortland area. During the seminar I was presented a plaque from the fire investigation team for providing them support and assistance.

The annual Homecoming Parade was on September 21, 2018 followed by the homecoming game and dance. The starting times for the parade and game had to be changed due the prediction of inclement weather but there were no issues.

On September 26, 2018, we, along with officers from the New York Western and Susquehanna Railroad Police, participated in Rail Safety Week (September $23^{rd} - 29^{th}$). Officers were at the railroad crossing on Cayuga St from 10am until 2pm and distributed pamphlets to motorists regarding railway safety. The New York Western and Susquehanna Railroad Police provided (reimbursed) the funding for this.

In conclusion, on September 29, 2018 will be the fall Drug Take Back Event at the Town Hall between 9am and noon. This event is sponsored by the Cortland Area Communities That Care.
