February 2019 Monthly report

Date: February 27, 2019

For the time period: 01/26/19 - 02/26/19

Mayor and members of the board,

Patrol Monthly Activities:

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. There were a total of 300 calls for service during the month of February. Officers had a total of 8 Penal Law arrests which consisted of 1 violation, 5 misdemeanors and 2 felonies. They conducted a total of 60 vehicle and traffic stops, which resulted in 27 traffic tickets being issued, 2 arrests for Aggravated Unlicensed Operation in the 3rd degree and an arrest for Driving While Intoxicated. They also investigated 9 motor vehicle collisions, all of which involved property damage only.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of February: a follow-up to sex offense investigation that was initially reported to the City of Cortland Police Department and it was determined offenses occurred in the village as well; a larceny investigation where a delivered package was stolen from an individual's porch; a larceny of an electronic tablet from an individual's backpack and a domestic related incident where an individual was arrested for harassment.

School Officers Reports:

Please refer to the attached detailed school resource officer's report for February of 2019. There were a total of 245 incidents that the resource officers were involved in during the month of February.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: No issues with the current cameras during the month of February.

Patrol vehicles updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance.

Bike patrol updates: The bikes have been stored for the winter months.

Grant updates: NYS Traffic Safety Grant - a voucher has been submitted and accepted by the state for reimbursement in the amount of \$947.52 for the first quarter of the grant.

Miscellaneous and Events:

The memorandum of understanding between the police department and Liberty Resources pertaining to the mobile crisis team was revised and has been signed. This will allow officers to request the mobile crisis team's response for residents or individuals who are in a crisis or in the need of help but not to the extent where they need to go to the hospital.

Since a majority of the village officers were not able to attend the county-wide active shooter training at SUNY Cortland in January, arrangements have been made with the Homer Central School District for and in-service active shooter training on March 23rd at the elementary school. We have recently purchased training equipment from the City of Cortland that we will utilize during this training.

As indicated in the January report, I began the officer's yearly evaluations for 2018. The evaluations are completed however there are some part-time officers that have not received them because they have not worked during February. It is expected that they will be completed by the end of March.

US Military Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) update: on February 26, 2019 I attended a meeting at the county office building where we were advised that military officials will be in the area for 3 days in May for planning conferences. The military is also seeking donations for certain equipment to use during the event (grills, forklifts, etc.).

The police department's awards presentation was held on February 13, 2019 at the town hall. This year the following officers (and civilian) received the following awards during the presentation: Distinguished Service Award was presented to Officer Christopher Parrow, from the Village of Homer Police Department and Officer Timothy Jones from the Cortland County Sheriff's Office, for encountering an individual during a welfare check who was holding a knife to his throat threatening self-harm, the officers were able to de-escalate the situation and take the individual to the hospital; Exceptional Duty Award was presented to Officer Matthew Compton of the Village of Homer Police Department for his continual professionalism and training of new officers; Long and Faithful Service Commendation was presented to Officer Parrow of the Village of Homer Police Department, who has served the Village of Homer community for 10 years; Good Conduct Award was presented to Officer Matthew Compton of the Village of Homer Police Department for 3 years without reprimand or any instances of disciplinary action; Chief's Achievement Award was presented to School Resource Officer Quentin Giles of the Village of Homer Police Department, who initiated a safety program within the schools through the National Child Safety Council and generated over \$2,400.00 in donations from businesses and people within the community for the program and the Homer Police Department Civilian Service Award was presented to 2018 Homer High School graduate Vincenzo Saraceno, who came to the aid of a fellow student in his time of need, which prevented the incident from become more tragic.

The police department utilizes Glock brand handguns. Officer Parrow and Officer Giles are the department's Glock armorers. Both officers armorer's certificates are due to expire this year. Officer Parrow was scheduled to attend an armorer's course on February 26, 2019 in Binghamton, NY but I was not successful in registering Officer Giles in this course (course was full). Therefore I have arranged for the police department to host the course on October 17th at the Cortland County Regional Training Center. For hosting the course the police department is able to have two officers attend it at no cost (I have scheduled Officer Giles and Officer Forbes). This course is open to officers from outside agencies to attend.

In conclusion, I would like to acknowledge Officers Compton, Smith and Forbes for saving 2 separate individuals lives that had overdosed during 2 separate incidents. The first incident occurred during the early morning hours on February 3, 2019 where Officer Compton assisted the sheriff's office outside of the village with an unresponsive person. Officer Compton administered NARCAN and revived the individual. The second incident occurred during the evening hours also on February 3, 2019 at a residence in the village where Officers Compton, Smith and Forbes responded to a residence in the village for an unresponsive person. The officers administered NARCAN to an individual and revived her. These officer's actions saved 2 individuals lives and I would like to commend them for that.

The School Resource Officer (SRO) program is a valuable partnership between The Village of Homer Police Department and Homer Central School District. The SRO's are based out of the school district buildings and maintains an office within the high school. This facilitates and allows the SRO's to be immediately accessible to students, faculty, administration and parents. The SRO's primary goals are to assist in maintaining the highest level of safety within our schools through prevention, and intervention as well as to reduce juvenile crime and incidents through education and counseling.

The SRO's investigate incidents which occur on the properties of schools within the Village of Homer (Elementary, Intermediate, Jr. High and High School). The SRO's facilitate assistance for all through the use of police department, school and community resources. The SRO's also conduct investigations, assist in certain student/parent meetings, phone consults, partner agency meetings, referrals, informal counseling, providing assistance to school officials and assistance to other police officers and agencies in regards to students or school issues and property.
