June 2019 Monthly report

For the time period: 05/26/19 - 06/26/19

Mayor and members of the board,

Patrol Monthly Activities:

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. There were a total of 422 calls for service during the month of June. Although officers did not have any Penal Law arrests in June, they conducted a total of 62 vehicle and traffic stops, which resulted in 30 traffic tickets being issued and 2 aggravated unlicensed operator arrests. They also investigated 14 motor vehicle collisions, 3 of which involved personal injuries.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of June: a traffic stop for a lighting defect where it was determined that the vehicle was reported stolen during a robbery in the City of Syracuse (investigation is continuing); a traffic stop for a passed red light where the operator was arrested for suspended license and the passenger was arrested for a warrant out of Ithaca; a larceny of a bicycle (it was subsequently recovered in the City of Cortland) and an assist to the fire department with a structure fire at a business within the village.

School Officers Reports:

Please refer to the attached detailed school resource officer's report for June of 2019. There were a total of 307 incidents that the resource officers were involved in during the month of June.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: No issues with the current cameras during the month of June. I did have communication with the owner of Beard Electric (Robert Beard) regarding installing cameras at the town hall (entrances). Mr Beard would like to meet with myself and or a board member for further discussion.

Patrol vehicles updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance. As indicated in the May monthly report, the 2020 Ford Explorer that will be replacing the 2016 Ford Taurus (126) went into production on June 17, 2019. An anticipated delivery date will be sometime in July or August.

Bike patrol updates: Due to the weather and scheduling conflicts they have only been out on a couple of patrols during June.

Grant updates: We have not received a notification as of yet as to an award amount for 2020.

Miscellaneous and Events:

US Military Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) update: I have been continually attending weekly meetings and there does not appear to be any issues. We are conducting the records checks on all the volunteers for the event until July 3, 2019. The military is expected to arriving at the school sometime on July 7, 2019 to set up.

There were several planned events in June, Relay for Life on the Village Green; Cortland Youth Bureau's fishing derby at Durkee Park, the Rotary Club's walk/run race, the Homer Fireman's Field Days and the field days parade. We assisted with traffic or were present during each of these events and there were no issues.

Officer's annual in-service firearms qualification training as the McGraw Rod and Gun Club was completed on June 19, 2019. However due to scheduling conflicts 2 part-time officers still need to qualify (a date will be set in July).

The remaining lockdown drills at the schools were completed in June. Sheriff's deputies and troopers assisted village officers and school resource officers with the drills.

During the last weekend in June will be the "Route 41 Sales" (yard/garage sales). These sales are along Route 41 between the villages of Skaneateles to Homer. This is the second year of these sales and unlike the Route 90 Sales there were no issues during this event last year.

In addition to the IRT, there are also other planned events in July. Holiday in Homer crafts sales and the Homer Congregation Church Race will be on July 20, 2019. The annual Route 90 sales will be on July 26 and 27, 2019. Officers will assist or monitor traffic during the race and sales as well as be present on the village green during the craft sales.

The School Resource Officer contract has been revised for the 2019-2020 school year and forwarded to the school as well as to the mayor for review. There was slight wage and change in hours from last year's contract.

In conclusion, with the summer months there has been an increase in people attempting to sell products to residents (peddlers). Residents are reminded to ask the person to see their peddlers permit issued by the village office and if they can't produce one, to call the police. This includes people offering to seal or repair driveways.

The School Resource Officer (SRO) program is a valuable partnership between The Village of Homer Police Department and Homer Central School District. The SRO's are based out of the school district buildings and maintains an office within the high school. This facilitates and allows the SRO's to be immediately accessible to students, faculty, administration and parents. The SRO's primary goals are to assist in maintaining the highest level of safety within our schools through prevention, and intervention as well as to reduce juvenile crime and incidents through education and counseling.

The SRO's investigate incidents which occur on the properties of schools within the Village of Homer (Elementary, Intermediate, Jr. High and High School). The SRO's facilitate assistance for all through the use of police department, school and community resources. The SRO's also conduct investigations, assist in certain student/parent meetings, phone consults, partner agency meetings, referrals, informal counseling, providing assistance to school officials and assistance to other police officers and agencies in regards to students or school issues and property.
