BOARD OF TRUSTEES PUBLIC HEARING

August 15th, 2019

PUBLIC HEARING #1: Recreation Reserves of \$6,779.50 will be used to purchase football equipment and cheerleader uniforms.

PUBLIC HEARING #2: A LOCAL LAW AMENDING HOMER CODE Section 194-5: Encroachments, OF THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE of HOMER in CORTLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF HOMER as follows: The VILLAGE of HOMER Code Section 194-5 is hereby amended by this Local Law to add these provisions as follows:

Section 1. Permit Required for

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter it shall be unlawful for any new restaurant or food establishment to permit any food or beverage service upon the public streets or sidewalks without receiving a permit from the Village of Homer. Restaurants which have already established food or beverage service upon the public streets or sidewalks prior to the enactment of this law are exempt from prosecutions and enforcement of this provision. Any new restaurant, person or establishment that violates this section shall be subject to the penalties in Section 149-9.

B. The Board of Trustees shall have the authority to establish any rules or fees for the required permit for any restaurant that wishes to serve food or have an outdoor seating area upon the street or sidewalks.

Section 2. Separability

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the BOARD OF TRUSTEES of the VILLAGE of HOMER hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 3. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law

July 2019 Monthly report

Date: July 26, 2019

For the time period: 06/26/19 – 07/26/19

Mayor and members of the board,

Patrol Monthly Activities:

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. There were a total of 459 calls for service during the month of July. Officers made 6 Penal Law arrests in July, which consisted of 4 misdemeanor and 2 violation arrests. They conducted a total of 40 vehicle and traffic stops, which resulted in 17 traffic tickets being issued, 1 aggravated unlicensed operator arrest and 1 driving while intoxicated arrest. They also investigated 10 motor vehicle collisions, 2 of which involved personal injuries.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of July: an attempted commercial burglary; a residential burglary; two separate larcenies from two separate businesses, one involved an employee stealing the deposit and the other involved a customer stealing products; criminal mischief to the slide in Newton Park; a domestic incident where an individual was arrested for harassment, criminal mischief and endangering the welfare of a child.

School Officers Reports:

No school resource officer's report due to summer vacation.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: No issues with the current cameras during the month of July.

Patrol vehicles updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance. No further information regarding the delivery date of the 2020 Ford Explorer that will be replacing the 2016 Ford Taurus (126). The anticipated delivery date for the vehicle will be sometime within the next few weeks.

Bike patrol updates: There has been an increase in bike patrols over the past few weeks, mainly during the evenings or Saturdays.

Grant updates: On July 8, 2019, I was notified that we were awarded \$4,884.00 by the governor's traffic safety committee for the police traffic services program in 2020 (\$3,700.00 for traffic enforcement and \$1,184 for seatbelt enforcement). This is an increase of \$1,073.00 compared to 2019's grant of \$3,811.00 (\$3,071.00 for traffic enforcement and \$740.00 for seatbelt enforcement).

Miscellaneous and Events:

US Military Innovative Readiness Training (IRT) update: The military arrived at the school on July 7, 2019 and after setting up began receiving patients on July 11, 2019. During the 10 day event, 2,477 patients were treated with 15,121 procedures being performed (Chenango County location there were 1,131 patients and 6,160 procedures). The total cost savings for patients was \$768,309.28 and it was outstanding for the community. Homer Officers provided security during the event and there were no notable incidents during it. I would like to specifically recognize the police department's records clerk, Kimberly Reitano. She conducted over 275 clearance checks on the volunteers that aided with this event. The clearance checks were in addition to Kim's daily tasks.

On July 13, 2019, members of the Homer Fire Department's West Side Hose Company #3, along with other members of the Homer Fire Department, hosted the 126th Convention of the Central New York Firemen's Association (CNYFA) at the Center for the Arts. During the awards ceremony Steve Shahan from the Tully Volunteer Fire Department was awarded firefighter of the year for his efforts for entering a structure fire and saving someone in July of 2018. Rachell Trimbell with the Walton Volunteer Fire Department was awarded the junior firefighter of the year for coming to the aid of a fellow student who was choking. It was an honor to be invited to this event as a representative of the police department and welcome participants to the village.

Holiday in Homer crafts sales and the Homer Congregation Church Race was on July 20, 2019. Officers assisted with traffic during the race and were present on the village green during the craft sales.

The "Route 41 Sales" (yard/garage sales) were the last weekend in June. This sale is not as busy as it relates to traffic and parking issues compared to the Route 90 Sales, which will be the last weekend in July. As in the past years, temporary no parking signs will be posted on the south side of Cayuga St (Route 90) during the sale to prevent any parking or traffic issues such as a fire truck not being able to safely pass while enroute to an emergency.

The revised School Resource Officer contract for the 2019-2020 school year was approved by the school board and was forwarded to the village board for final approval.

In conclusion, in the recent weeks I have had some discussion with the mayor, the Homer Town Supervisor as well as the county legislature that represents Homer regarding the Interstate 81 grid option in Syracuse. Although there have been community meetings in various areas in Onondaga County, the grid option would ultimately effect the village with an increase in traffic. People now traveling on Interstate 81 with a desire to travel west bound on the thruway get off in Homer to travel Route 41 to get on the thruway in Weedsport or other exit. If the grid option is put in place people would not want to travel several miles out of their way on Route 481 (east) to get onto the thruway and would get off in Homer thereby increasing the traffic in the village. With the board's permission, I would like to contact the state department of transportation and have a community forum in the village regarding this matter.

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BOARD OF TRUSTEES PUBLIC HEARING

August 15th, 2019

PUBLIC HEARING #1: Recreation Reserves of \$6,779.50 will be used to purchase football equipment and cheerleader uniforms.

PUBLIC HEARING #2: A LOCAL LAW AMENDING HOMER CODE Section 194-5: Encroachments, OF THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE of HOMER in CORTLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF HOMER as follows: The VILLAGE of HOMER Code Section 194-5 is hereby amended by this Local Law to add these provisions as follows:

Section 1. Permit Required for

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter it shall be unlawful for any new restaurant or food establishment to permit any food or beverage service upon the public streets or sidewalks without receiving a permit from the Village of Homer. Restaurants which have already established food or beverage service upon the public streets or sidewalks prior to the enactment of this law are exempt from prosecutions and enforcement of this provision. Any new restaurant, person or establishment that violates this section shall be subject to the penalties in Section 149-9.

B. The Board of Trustees shall have the authority to establish any rules or fees for the required permit for any restaurant that wishes to serve food or have an outdoor seating area upon the street or sidewalks.

Section 2. Separability

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the BOARD OF TRUSTEES of the VILLAGE of HOMER hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 3. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law
