Honorable Mayor and Trustees,

The monthly fire report has been submitted for your review.

September report

I attended the Company Meetings, Village Department Head meeting, and the Department Board Meeting along with Monthly training, Officers meeting, County Chiefs and Fire Advisory Board. I did a video interview with the Cortland School Video Club about our 9-11 Memorial Steel. Also attended the Community Preparedness Training class at the Regional Training Center.

The chassis for the new engine has arrived at 4-Guys for pump and body mounting and manufacture. The current estimate for delivery of the completed apparatus is sometime in March or April of 2020.

All components of the dry hydrant for East River Crossing in the Town of Homer were inspected by our Forest Ranger and a voucher with the State was filled out and submitted for reimbursement. We will see our 50% in about 2-3 months of \$1088.95 and I asked Tanya to send an invoice to the Town of Homer Fire District for the other 50% which they committed to paying.

We were notified that the FEMA grant that we submitted for the purchase of 25 SCBA face pieces for our SCBA certified firefighters was successful. I'm soliciting current quotes for the purchase of the face pieces and may be able to amend the grant for more and bags to carry them in, due to the fact that the price is coming in less than that that was submitted in the application. The grant amount is for \$12,175.00. FEMA share is \$11,595.23 with our match of \$569.77.

I attended a meeting with the Town of Summerhill town board and the Mayor and Deputy Mayor to discuss our relationship and the fire protection contract.

I also attended a meeting with the Central New York Fire Districts Association and ESIP at the ESIP offices in regard to our potential to enter into a Joint Fire District and what it takes and what help they could offer. The presentation meeting has been rescheduled to Monday October 21 at 7 PM at the Town Hall meeting room.

I have been working on preparing a proposed budget for a Fire District to have at the meeting.

Both hose and pump testing have been scheduled for October as is required by the Cortland County Mutual Aid agreement. All hose will be tested, and Engine 1, Engine 3 and Ladder 531 fire pumps will be tested to NFPA standards.

The Board has approved me to list Engine 503 for sale, but I'd like permission to electronically sign the agreement which I'll have a copy for your review.

Please refer to the attached detailed reports for last month. There were a total of 437 calls for service during the month of September. Officers made 2 Penal Law arrests in September, which consisted of 1 violation and 1 misdemeanor. They conducted a total of 88 vehicle and traffic stops, which resulted in 86 traffic tickets being issued. They also investigated 6 motor vehicle collisions, all of which involved property damage only.

Notable investigations or incidents during the month of September: a fraud investigation where a resident's debit card was used at various locations; a larceny investigation at a local business (possibly a civil matter); a possible attempted burglary investigation (no entry was gained) and a larceny investigation at a business, possibly involving an employee.

School Officers Reports:

Please refer to the attached detailed school resource officer's report for September of 2019. There were a total of 265 incidents that the resource officers were involved in during the month of September.

Recent updates:

Security cameras updates: No issues with the current cameras during the month of September. I met with Robert Beard from Beard Electric and we looked at various areas at installing security cameras at the town/village hall, compost site and community building as well as adding a camera at Calale Field. He provided an estimate, which was forwarded to the village clerk.

Patrol vehicle updates: No issues with the patrol vehicles regarding maintenance. The 2020 Ford Explorer that will be replacing the 2016 Ford Taurus (126) was delivered on September 26, 2019. It will be going to Priority Fire in Cortland so that the radio, divider and other equipment can be installed in it followed by O'Graphic Designs in Marathon for decaling.

Bike patrol updates: During the month of September there were only a few bike patrol shifts due to the weather and scheduling. There will be a few bike patrol shifts in October (homecoming and Halloween night).

Grant updates: During the month of September we utilized the remaining balance from the 2019 traffic safety grant by conducting traffic enforcement in school zones. The 2020 grant period will begin on October 1, 2019.

Miscellaneous and Events:

Follow-up to the commercial vehicle inspection on August 29, 2019 involving Homer Officers and troopers from the New York State Police Commercial Vehicle Enforcement Unit along with safety inspectors from the New York State Department of Transportation. A total of 70 commercial motor vehicles were inspected with a total of 32 vehicle's placed out of service and 9 drivers were placed out of service. 2 drivers were arrested for possession of marihuana while operating a commercial motor vehicle. 2 vehicles were overweight and 14 were over length. There were a total of 232 commercial vehicle violations cited and 49 tickets were issued by officers and troopers.

On September 5, 2019, I attended a meeting regarding use and safe disposal of hypodermic needles at the Cortland County Health Department. In an effort to reduce the unsafe disposal of hypodermic needles in the community we will be exploring the possibility of having a disposal kiosk, similar to the drug kiosk placed at the police department and other areas in Cortland County.

September 11, 2019, was the 18th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on this country by terrorist. Ceremonies marking the anniversary were in City of Cortland in the morning and in the evening in the village. Several people and first responders attended the ceremonies.

On September 25, 2019, Sgt Eckard and I attended a hate crimes investigation training at SUNY Environmental Science and Forestry (ESF) in Syracuse. There was no cost associated with this training that was presented by the New York State Police, representatives from the Anti- Defamation League, NYS Division of Human Rights and NYS Homeland Security. The training provided an overview of hate crimes laws, things to look for to indicate a bias-related crime, investigative strategies including victim sensitivity and community outreach.

September 22nd through the 28th was Railway Safety Weeks. To remind people of the dangers associated with railways, on September 26, 2019, village officers along with officers from the New York Western and Susquehanna Railroad Police, distributed pamphlets to motorists regarding railway safety while at the crossing on Cayuga Street. The railroad will be reimbursing the village for the officers time.

On Saturday, September 28, 2019, will be the fall drug take back event. Unused medications will be collected at the Homer Town Hall, Cortlandville Fire Department, Marathon Fire Department and Cincinnatus Fire Department. This event is hosted by the Cortland Area Communities that Care and it is a means of safely disposing of unused medications.

Over the past several months I have attended meetings regarding New York State's Criminal Justice Reform law changes that will be effective January 1, 2020 (No-Bail and Discovery). The last meeting was with the Cortland County District Attorney and other law enforcement agency leaders. The law changes I am afraid to report will possibly affect public safety state-wide and not in a positive way. Officers will be receiving inservice training in December so they will be aware of the changes.

National Coffee With a Cop Day is on October 2, 2019. We have registered for this event and officers will be at Sinfully Sweet Café from 7am-10am. Spectrum News contacted me and they will be doing segments / interviews at the café during this event.

The Homecoming football game and parade this year will be on October 4, 2019. This year Homer is competing against Cortland and we are expecting a larger than normal crowd. We have been communicating with the school planning for this event so that there are no issues.

We will be hosting and co-hosting two separate trainings in October. On October 17th with will be hosting a Glock armorer's course and on October 22nd we will be co-hosting an Elder Abuse Investigation training with Cortland County Department of Social Services and Department of the Aging. Both trainings will be at the Cortland Regional Training Center and there is no cost associated for Homer Officers that will be attending.

Fall Firearms and in-service training will be on October 29th and 30th and November 5th and 6th. The training will involve low-light (dark) shooting as well as utilizing the sheriff's newly acquired firearms simulator.

In conclusion, on June 6, 2019, I nominated Officer Howell for the American Red Cross of Central New York's 21st annual "Real Hero breakfast" for his actions during a structure fire on April 5th of this year in the village. The event celebrates the Red Cross mission of alleviating human suffering by recognizing residents from Cayuga, Cortland, Madison, Onondaga and Oswego counties who have performed heroic acts in life-threatening situations or have worked to make a positive impact in their community. I am pleased to inform you that Officer Howell was selected to receive this award on December 4, 2019 at the On-Center in Syracuse, NY.

The School Resource Officer (SRO) program is a valuable partnership between The Village of Homer Police Department and Homer Central School District. The SRO's are based out of the school district buildings and maintains an office within the high school. This facilitates and allows the SRO's to be immediately accessible to students, faculty, administration and parents. The SRO's primary goals are to assist in maintaining the highest level of safety within our schools through prevention, and intervention as well as to reduce juvenile crime and incidents through education and counseling.

The SRO's investigate incidents which occur on the properties of schools within the Village of Homer (Elementary, Intermediate, Jr. High and High School). The SRO's facilitate assistance for all through the use of police department, school and community resources. The SRO's also conduct investigations, assist in certain student/parent meetings, phone consults, partner agency meetings, referrals, informal counseling, providing assistance to school officials and assistance to other police officers and agencies in regards to students or school issues and property.
