Village of Homer Board of Trustees Meeting January 8, 2020 6:02 p.m.

A Public Hearing for the Village of Homer Board of Trustees was held at Town Hall, 31 North Main St., Homer, New York with Deputy Mayor Clune presiding.

Members present:

Trustee, Patrick Clune Trustee, Edward Finkbeiner Trustee, Kevin Slack

Village Clerk Egnor read the public hearing: Pursuant to Village Law Section 5-508 (3), the Village Board of Trustees will hold a Public Hearing to Adopt the Final Budget of the Village of Homer for the FY 20/21.

Further, monies from Special Reserves and Fund Balance will be used thusly:

- Police Car Reserve for a New Vehicle at \$39,052
- Municipal Property Reserve for Local Match for a Dam Removal Grant at \$50,000
- Municipal Property Reserve for Local Match of a Salt Shed Grant at \$80,000
- Machinery Reserve for Two Garbage Trucks at \$110,000
- Fund Balance for Two Garbage Trucks at \$110,000

Deputy Mayor opened for comments noting the Village kept the budget to half percent increase in real property taxes. We earmarked fund balance for use above. Programs for aging, the budget increased from \$100 to \$1,000 due to County cuts and noting the staff are looking to hold some activities because of the County cuts.

Village Treasurer DiGennaro noted there were no increase in water and sewer rates. Funds are being reserved for a large plow purchase in the future. The Village also is contracting to put the code book online and make it so its searchable. \$20,000 machinery reserves are added to replace the water and sewer van. Also, the Village is putting money into a football equipment reserve to ensure helmets are safe for children for years to come. For the fire department, the Village is starting an SCBA reserve fund to replace the equipment that has a fifteen-year life span. Also, included are the net costs for the dam removal and the salt shed.

Motion to approve the budget as presented by Trustee Finkbeiner, Seconded by Trustee Slackall ayes.
